Reading ability lies at the heart of education. Make reading a fun activity; use the word 'we' as much as possible and not the word 'you'. Thus, reading is a joint activity rather than an exercise to be performed solely by the child.

Choose a regular time and a place to read with your child. This place should be quiet and surrounded as much as possible with books. Let your young reader be surrounded by print and real books. Being surrounded by print makes it easier for the child to take to reading. Reading to your child & with your child and having him read out to you will ensure that your child blooms into a competent and confident reader!

Reading Activities to be done with your child's library book:

- Discuss the title of the book
- Every picture has a story to tell, ask your young creative artist to describe the pictures in the book.
- Let your child draw a picture of what he/she liked best in the Journal notebook. Your child can say more through drawing than language at this stage and will thus retain the story better.
