School Guidelines

Attendance

- The first bell in the morning is at 8.10 a.m., followed by morning assembly. Students using their own transport must reach school before 8.10 a.m.
- If a student is unable to attend school, prior information must be given by 7-.30 a.m.
- A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory. However, for Board class students (Grades 10 & 12), 85% attendance is mandatory.
- We emphasize the importance of regular attendance at school to help children achieve the best results. Kindly ensure that your child is regular and punctual.
- The school does not encourage children to be taken early or brought late to the school. In case it is unavoidable, the parent must send a note to the class teacher. While taking a child early from school, kindly ensure that the gate pass (issued by the academic team) is submitted at the front office.

Leave Schedule

- Parents must inform the Class Teacher if the student is on leave for a day or two, either through a note in the student handbook or via email.
- If a student is absent for three or more consecutive days, a leave letter stating the reason must be emailed to the Principal with CC to the Vice Principal, Section Coordinator and Class Teacher.

- If a student needs to take leave for an extended period due to unavoidable reasons, prior permission must be obtained from the Principal.
- In the event of an unforeseen leave of absence for a long period of time, parents will need to assist the student with the lessons and notes that have been completed.
- Vacations or personal trips during school days will not be considered valid reasons for absence.

Health & Hygiene

- Students feeling unwell must wear a mask while travelling in the bus and in school.
- Any student reporting to school while visibly unwell may be sent home at the discretion of the school nurse or administration.
- Students must have a wholesome breakfast. An empty stomach is harmful to their physical as well as intellectual growth.
- Parents are requested to inform the school if the child is unwell. In the event of contagious diseases, parents are advised to keep the child at home.
- Do ensure that your child carries an umbrella/raincoat to school during the monsoon season.
- In the event of the child being unwell while in school, the child will be attended to by the school nurse. The school infirmary is equipped to take care of first aid.
- If the student is to carry medication to school, please ensure that a note with regard to the same is included in the handbook. Medication must be handed over to the class teacher.

Communication

- From time to time, you will get information about the activities at The Charter School through Newsletters, Circulars and/or Emails.
- Please acknowledge receipt of all notes and communication received through the handbook.
- All information and updates will be passed on to all parents via SMS and/or Email.

Bus Discipline Guidelines

Students are under the supervision of the school bus driver and the support staff while in transit. For everyone's safety, students and parents must follow these transport rules :

- Be punctual at the designated stop to help the bus stay on schedule. Inform the bus in-charge by 6.30 am if not using the school bus. The bus will not wait at any stop.
- The bus will not wait for more than 2 minutes. Kindly check the live location updates and be present at your designated stop on time.
- Do not tamper with the bus or its equipment.
- Keep the bus clean and safe. Eating is not allowed inside the bus.
- The Bus Boarding Card must be worn at all times, while in the bus.
- Students are required to sit in the designated spots assigned to them and should not stand or move around, while in the bus.
- Students are to remain in their seats at all times, except when the bus has come to a complete halt at their stop.

- Students are to speak respectfully. Use of foul or offensive language will not be tolerated.
- Students are not allowed to peep or put their hands out through the windows.
- Students must sit facing the front of the bus.
- Students should not throw items out of the bus windows, around the bus or litter inside the bus.
- Unruly or noisy behavior distracts the driver and is dangerous. In such cases, the driver will stop the bus, parents will be informed and disciplinary action will follow.
- Drivers will stop only at designated stops unless authorized by school officials.
- Students must board and get off only at their regular stop unless prior approval is given.
- For route changes or taking a different bus, prior permission is required.
- Parents must contact the transport in-charge for any request or issues.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the bus or interact with students without permission.
- All concerns regarding pick up/drop must be addressed through the bus or transport in-charge.

NOTE : Violating these rules may result in disciplinary action, including suspension of bus privileges. Unsafe driving misconduct by the driver/support staff or any other issues faced in the bus must be reported to the Class Teacher, Coordinator, Vice Principal or Principal.

Own Transport

- Children should be escorted to and from the school by authorised persons only.
- Drivers of students commuting to school by their own transport (autos, cars, vans, etc.) and authorised persons escorting the students to school will be issued an entry pass to enter the school premises which must be made available on demand. In the event of a change of driver/vehicle, please see that the entry pass is made available on demand. This is in the interest and safety of your child.
- Late arrival is not applicable to the students coming via school transport.
- Late arrivals will be marked in the Student Handbook. In case of repeated late arrivals, parent will be called to meet the Principal.

Students' dress code

- All students must wear their ID cards on all working days.
- Students should come neatly dressed and maintain the dress code prescribed for them.
- Black school shoes with grey school socks are to be worn along with the Formal school uniform.
- On the days that students are permitted to wear casual clothes, do ensure that they are suitably attired for school. To maintain a respectful learning environment, attire such as crop tops, spaghetti strap tops, ripped jeans and similar attires should be avoided. Dress and deportment speak volumes for the student and the institution.

- Only small ear studs are permitted for girls. Other jewellery and ornaments are not permitted. The school cannot be held responsible for any loss.
- Students are not permitted to :
 - a) Colour/streak/highlight their hair
 - b) Grow/varnish their nails
 - c) Have fancy hairstyle with flashy clips/accessories
 - d) Use coloured chapsticks/makeup
- Students shall maintain a neat and well-groomed appearance. Boys must maintain regularly-cut, neatly trimmed and well-kept hair. Overgrown hair will not be allowed for boys. Boys are expected to remain clean-shaven and are not permitted to grow beards.
- Girls must tie their hair neatly in a ponytail using black/dark blue/white hair bands.
- Girls must wear cotton tights as part of their daily school uniform.
- White/coloured shoes/socks, Crocs, slippers etc. are strictly not permitted with the school uniform. Students are permitted to wear only the school approved hoodie with Charter School logo.
- **Check the Uniform Annexure sent in the email for comprehensive guidelines and specifications.**
- **Students are expected to strictly adhere to the guidelines given in the Uniform Annexure Guidelines.**
- **Modifications or deviations in the uniforms will not be permitted.**

Footwear

- Only plain black school shoes are allowed.
- In case of a foot injury, kindly inform the respective class teacher.
- Students are allowed to wear plain Black Sandals only on rainy days/in case of leg injury.

Sports Uniform

- Students must wear the Sports Uniform on the days they have PE/Swimming. On all other working days, students must wear the regular school uniform, unless mentioned otherwise.
- Specific sports shoes must be worn only during the particular sport activity.

Co-curricular Activities

- At The Charter School, Physical and Arts Education is given due importance and training in each discipline forms an integral part of the curriculum. The main objective of this design is to communicate that sensitivity to both arts and sports is important to evolve into a well-rounded personality.

Student Assessment

- The academic year comprises of two terms for Grades K1 - XII (June-September, October-March)
- Grades will be awarded for performance in co-scholastic areas too.
- Assessment and evaluation are an integral part of learning and schooling. At The Charter School, the method of assessment differs as per the need and requirement of the age group.

- Report on conduct, application and progress will be sent to you at the end of each term.
- Every child develops and assimilates at their own pace. Kindly ensure that your child sets aside time for school work daily. You are requested to create a 'stress free' atmosphere at home with regard to academic pursuits. You are most welcome to discuss any point pertaining to the child with the Class Teacher/Subject Teacher/Section Coordinator.
- Eligibility for promotion is based on the performance in the tests/ exams and continuous assessments conducted during the academic year. Students should ensure that they do not miss any of the examinations / tests.

Examination Rules - Internal and Board Examinations

- Students need to carry stationery only in transparent pouches for all Test and Examinations.
- Smart watches are strictly prohibited, any violation will lead to immediate confiscation and disciplinary action.
- Gestures, talking or any form of communication during the exam is strictly prohibited and may result in paper cancellation or further disciplinary measures.
- Disciplinary action will be taken if a student is found to indulge in malpractice during exams.

Mental Health and Well-being

- At The Charter School, we prioritize the mental health and emotional well-being of our students. We are committed to creating a nurturing environment where students feel safe, supported and valued.

Guidelines for Mental Well-being

- Students are encouraged to speak openly about their mental health concerns in a safe and confidential environment.
- The School Counsellor is available for one-on-one sessions to address emotional concerns, stress management, anxiety and coping strategies.
- Mental health awareness programs will be conducted regularly to educate students about recognizing signs of distress and seeking help.
- Peer support initiatives and mindfulness activities will be integrated to promote emotional resilience.

Confidentiality Policy

- All counselling interactions are confidential unless there is a risk of harm to the student or others.

Emergency Support Resources at School

- In case of immediate emotional distress or safety concerns, students and parents are encouraged to

Reach out to the Class Teacher

Contact the School Counsellor.

Walk-in and meet the Principal or Vice Principal for urgent support.

Meetings with Teachers

- Parent will get opportunities to meet Class Teachers, Subject Teachers and respective Section Coordinators on Open Days scheduled as per calendar.
- Parents are also free to communicate with the concerned teacher via the handbook.
- Parents are not allowed to meet the teachers during class hours without the permission of the Principal / Section Coordinator.
- Parents will be invited for events and celebrations during the academic year.

Parent Teacher Meeting - P. T. M

- P. T. M is scheduled after every term exam, when the academic progress is shared. It is important that both parents attend the P. T. M and get feedback on the child's performance at school in scholastic and non-scholastic areas.
- Children need to accompany their parents while meeting the teachers, during P. T. M.

Field trips

- During the school year, students will be taken on field trips with prior intimation.

Mobile Phone Usage

- Mobile phones and other electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited unless approved by school for academic use. They should be switched off and handed over to the Class Teacher/Coordinator/ Vice Principal while in school.

- Unauthorized use in school van / school premises will lead to confiscation and appropriate disciplinary action.

Social Media Etiquette and Digital Responsibility

- Students are advised to engage in social media only with parent's approval and supervision. It is recommended that parents adhere to the respective social media platform's age restrictions (e.g. 13 years or older), monitor their children's online activity, content exposure and educate them on safe usage, cyberbullying and the importance of privacy.
- Students should use social media responsibly and must not engage in any activities like sharing inappropriate or misleading content that harm the reputation of the school, teachers or fellow students.
- Cyberbullying and harassment are strictly prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.
- Students must respect privacy and should not share pictures, videos or personal details of others without their consent.
- The use of the school's name, logo or uniform in any online post should be done only with prior approval from school authorities.
- If a student faces any cyber threats, bullying or inappropriate behaviour online they should immediately report it to their teacher/Coordinator/School Counsellor/Vice Principal or Principal.
- The school reserves the right to involve parents and, if necessary, legal authorities, in cases of serious cyber misconduct.

Prohibited Items Policy

To ensure a safe and focused learning environment, students must not bring the following items to school :

- **Electronics** : Mobile Phones, Smartwatches (unless approved), gaming devices and music players.
- **Hazardous Items** : Sharp objects, firecrackers, lighters or chemicals.
- **Prohibited Substances** : Tobacco, Alcohol, drugs or unprescribed medication (unless reported to the school nurse).
- **Inappropriate Content** : Materials Promoting violence, discrimination or explicit content.
- **Disruptive Items** : Laser pointers, prank items or distracting toys.
- **Valuables** : Excessive cash, jewellery or expensive belongings.

Note : Confiscated items will be returned to parents and disciplinary action may follow if necessary. Students should consult their teacher or School Counsellor if unsure about an item.

General

- Uniform and grooming checks will be conducted regularly. Non-compliance may result in a disciplinary note to parents.
- Parents are requested to monitor the time spent by their children on T.V. viewing, use of the computer and the phone. Over-exposure and unmonitored use could be detrimental to their performance at school as well as their overall development. Please inculcate in them the habit of a regular study time and also monitor if a child requires parental support or guidance at home.

- Students must ensure that homework/assignments/projects assigned to them are submitted on time. Parents, however, will be required to provide materials needed for the same.
- In order to identify their personal belongings, do write the child's name on each and every item of theirs with a permanent marker .
- Cash-free zones : To ensure security and convenience, we encourage cashless transactions. Money transactions are strictly prohibited inside the school campus among students.
- Students must respect and take care of all school property. Any damage must be reported to the Class Teacher immediately. Strict disciplinary action including appropriate restitution, will be taken if a student damages school property. In such cases parents may be required to bear the cost of repair or replacement.
- Use of inappropriate language, gestures or behaviour will lead to disciplinary action.
- Money, CDs, pen drives, etc. should not be brought to school unless specifically asked for, by the teacher.
- Students must neither bring nor exchange gifts of any kind in school, irrespective of the occasion, except for the Christmas Gift Exchange. They may bring in gifts in the event of a school charity drive as instructed.
- Only Smart watches with basic fitness features alone (not too expensive) are allowed for students of Grade 5 and above. Students are advised not to remove their watches at school. The school cannot be held responsible for any loss.
- Use of chewing gum is strictly banned in School.

- For birthdays, students may wear casual clothes. The School does not entertain the distribution of any edible items to mark the occasion, however children may distribute stationery like pencils, erasers, bookmarks etc. to their classmates or contribute a book/board game to the class as a lasting and benefitting gift to their classmates.
- The school expects the wholehearted participation of all parents in all the school functions and workshops conducted by the school in the interest of their child.
- Students are expected to refrain from having or displaying tattoos while on school premises.
- The wearing of jewellery as a fashion accessory is not permitted.
- Should a situation arise where ear piercing for boys is necessitated for religious reasons, parents are requested to take prior written consent from the School Principal.
- Parents must go through the Handbook daily and ensure that it is brought to school daily. It is an excellent channel of communication.

Bullying Prevention and Intervention

- We are committed to maintaining a safe and respectful learning environment for all students.
- **Definition of Bullying :** Bullying includes physical, verbal, emotional or cyber harassment intended to hurt, intimidate or isolate an individual.

Reporting Procedures

- Students can report incidents of bullying directly to the School Counselor, Class Teacher, Principal, Vice Principal, Coordinators or any trusted staff member.
- For anonymity, students may use the Listening Post Box placed in the school.
- Reports will be handled with confidentiality and appropriate intervention steps will follow.

Prevention Measures

- Awareness campaigns and workshops will be conducted to educate students about identifying, preventing and responding to bullying.
- Peer mentoring programs will be used to encourage students to support each other in maintaining a positive school environment.
- Our Staff is being continuously trained in recognizing bullying behaviour and taking appropriate steps to intervene.

The Charter Curriculum Design

- CCD ensures that every child develops the attributes, knowledge and skills needed to do well in school and life in general. In addition to academic excellence, the defined objective is to enable each child to be a curious learner, a confident individual, a responsible citizen and an effective contributor.

Curriculum Framework

- The Charter School's Innovative Curriculum incorporates the best global practices into the CBSE framework.
- The primary purpose is to create the right environment for a child to develop into an empowered individual and a responsible world citizen.
- Assessment is a continuous and reflective process within the curriculum framework that emphasises on the progress of every student.
- Our curriculum is the sum total of all the specifically planned set of academic and co-curricular educational experiences provided to the student at the school.

Academic & Career Counseling

- Our Academic and Career Counseling services are designed to guide students in making informed decisions about their educational and career paths.

Key Focus Areas

- **Subject Selection Guidance** : Personalized advice on choosing subjects aligned with students strengths and career aspirations.
- **Career Exploration** : Resources and sessions to explore diverse career pathways, university options and vocational programs.

- **Skill Development** : Support in building essential skills such as communication, leadership and critical thinking.
- **University and College Guidance** : Assistance with application processes, entrance exams and scholarships.

Attendance at the Career Day and Career Fair is mandatory for both parents and students as per the communicated schedule.

- **Appointment Process** : Students may book individual or group sessions with the Academic & Career Counselor by visiting the counselling department.

Discipline Guidelines for Students of The Charter School

- All students, parents and members of The Charter School must abide by the guidelines, rules and regulations established by The Charter School.

The Provincial Code of Conduct

- Students are expected to treat all members of the school community, including the management, teachers, staff, peers and visitors, with respect and dignity.
- To promote responsible citizenship.
- To maintain an environment where conflicts and differences can be addressed in a manner characterized by respect and civility.
- To encourage the use of non-violent means to resolve conflicts.

Standards of behaviour

Meet & Greet Etiquette

- Respectful and courteous behavior leads to maintaining a positive school environment.

Keep left policy in Corridors

- Students must walk on the left side of the corridor at all times. This ensures smooth movement and avoids congestion.
- Running or pushing in the corridors is strictly not allowed for safety reasons.
- Be mindful and respectful of others while moving around in the campus.

All members of the school community must:

- Respect and comply with all applicable laws in India.
- Demonstrate honesty and integrity.
- Respect differences in people, their ideas and their opinions.
- Treat one another with dignity and respect at all times, especially when there is a disagreement.
- Respect the rights of others.
- Show proper care and regard for school property and the property of others.
- Take appropriate measures to help those in need.
- Seek assistance from a member of the school staff, if necessary, to resolve conflicts personally.

- Respect all members of the school community, especially persons in positions of authority.
- Respect the need of others to work in an environment that is conducive to learning and teaching.

Parents' Responsibility

Parents play an important role in the education of their children and can support the efforts of the school staff in maintaining a safe and respectful learning environment for all students. Parents must:

- Show an active interest in their child's school work and progress.
- Communicate regularly with the school.
- Help their child to be neat, appropriately dressed and prepared for school.
- Ensure that their child attends school regularly and on time.
- Promptly report to the school of their child's absence or late arrival.
- Show that they are familiar with the provincial Code of Conduct and school rules.
- Encourage and assist their child in following the Code of Conduct and guidelines.
- Assist school staff in dealing with disciplinary issues involving their child.
- Parents of Grades 8-12 students are encouraged to participate in the University Expos & Fairs arranged by the school along with their child.

Disciplinary Action

Violation of any of the school rules will entail disciplinary action in the following stages:

- Minor offences: Verbal warning to the student.
- Serious/repeated offences: Intimation to parents by the Teacher/Section Coordinator.
- Meeting of the parent or guardian with the Section Coordinator.
- Disciplinary action as per the nature of the offence.
- All offences committed by the student will be recorded in the Student Anecdotal Record.

Terms & Conditions for School Transportation

1. Upon availing transport facility, I will abide by all rules, instructions and regulations of the School in this regard and all other applicable laws including any amendments thereto in any form and manner in this regard.
2. The School reserves the right to frame, amend, revoke, repeal and enforce the Rules & Regulations, as and when deemed fit; and it shall be my duty to keep myself well-versed and updated with the amended Rules & Regulations as applicable from time to time; the School shall not be bound or responsible to intimate me separately in any manner, in this regard.
3. I understand that the School may provide me the transport facility at its own or through other arrangement as it may deem fit.

4. I agree that I shall not be entitled for transport facility as a matter of right by submitting this enclosure of the common admission form.
5. I agree that I shall board the transport vehicle from the assigned boarding point/location only. I further agree that I shall make the required adjustments for my transport facility as per the specific requirement of the School for a specific time due to any reason, whatever it may be.
6. I understand that transport vehicle allotted and various provisions and facilities in the transport may vary or be subject to change from time to time as decided by the School.
7. I agree that my child shall carry the transport identity card along with the RFID card all the time during transit in the transport vehicle and shall be liable to produce the same as and when the deputed personnel and/or concerned authorities ask for.
8. I agree that if declared ineligible to appear in any examination of the School, due to shortage of attendance, any other reason or if my child is detained during the program due to misconduct or any other reason whatsoever, I shall not avail of transport facility if School authorities so decide at any time, I would not be entitled to any refund of fees. Availing of transport facility in the ensuing term(s) may be allowed only at the sole discretion of the School.
9. I understand and agree that transport fee and related charges are subject to revision from time to time as decided by the School.
10. I shall be liable to pay for any damage caused by me/my ward to the transport vehicle or provisions therein either alone or jointly with others and subject my ward to any disciplinary action which the School may adopt in this regard.

11. I agree that my ward may be subject to all possible disciplinary action including but not limited to cancellation of his/her admission or transport facility at any time as decided by the School. In case my ward has been found guilty of any sort of disobedience of any of the transport rules and regulations notwithstanding legal action under the law of the land, I shall not be entitled to claim for refund of fees and other amounts paid unless otherwise decided by the School.
12. I understand that in some of the routes school doesn't have access to ply the buses due to narrow lanes, in-roads or narrow entry and exit. Hence there will not be door to door facility for school transportation in such cases.
13. I understand that payment of Transportation charges shall be paid in installments and if an installment falls due, for e.g., on 10/05/24, cancellation to be submitted before the due date of the current installment. Cancellations in between installments cannot be accepted; therefore full payment will be applicable.
14. I further understand that for evening stay back or early morning coaching trips for students, buses are available only on main routes hence we shall adhere to the directions of school authorities from time to time.
15. I agree that if any address change / bus number changes are required, the same will be under the discretion of management and availability of seats on the concerned buses.
